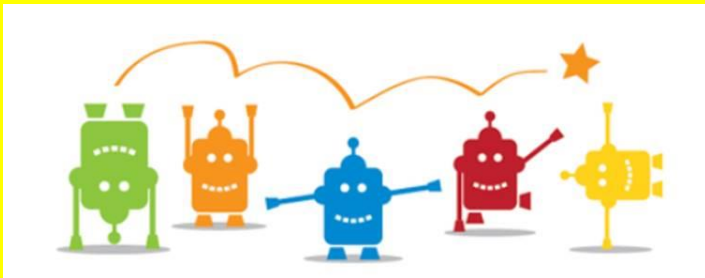


Lincoln Park Academy Newsletter

Rice and Ratios

HOW TO BE CAREFUL ONLINE

With my daughter using the internet for schoolwork, I was concerned she would wander to unsafe sites. We set up parental controls as her teacher recommended, and I try to stay nearby when she’s on the computer.

But, my older sister reminded me that while supervision is important, Sophie needs to learn safe habits to use on her own. So I explained to Sophie that real-life safety rules apply online.

For instance, she shouldn’t talk to strangers or go places she’s not allowed. Before visiting a new site, she has to check with me so that I can make sure it’s appropriate. And just as in real life, she needs to tell me right away if a stranger tries to contact her or if she sees something confusing or upsetting.

I feel better that Sophie has ground rules, and I am going to keep this conversation going.
